WELCOME TO CAMP LEJEUNE

Among some of the top coastal towns of North Carolina and boasting its own enviable 14 miles of ocean frontage sits the sprawling Marine Corps Base of Camp Lejeune. This is a sparkling coastal community with deeply rooted military pride where the locals will quickly make sure you pronounce their beloved Camp "luh-JERN" correctly.

Camp Lejeune is home to the largest concentration of Marines and Navy Sailors in the world and makes up approximately one third of Onslow County in Jacksonville, NC.

Life is peaceful and complete here at Lejeune where small town living, coastal hot spots and cities such as Wilmington and Raleigh are all within easy reach. If a relaxed lifestyle of beaches, quaint southern charm and exploring one-of-a-kind attractions sounds ideal to you, you'll love this new assignment.

Camp Lejeune Quick Facts:

- Camp Lejeune is on approximately 156,000 acres of land that includes an impressive mix of oceanfront, New River tidal shoreline and forestry.
- It is home to over 130,000 Marines, Sailors, Department of Defense civilians and their families.
- Camp Lejeune was first established in 1941 and was named in honor of the 13th Commandant of the Marine Corps, John A. Lejeune.
- Closeby are several smaller USMC bases including New River and Stone Bay.

More on Camp Lejeune

Camp Lejeune, "Home of Expeditionary Forces in Readiness," exists to support the various USMC commands, a major Navy command, a Coast Guard command and the base itself. It is home to the II Marine Expeditionary Force, the II Marine Division, II Marine Logistics Group, Marine Corps Forces Special Operations Command (MARSOC) and additional combat and support units.

COMMUTING

Surrounding Cities and Major Destinations

Exploring some of the best destinations the Carolinas have to offer is one of the perks of centrally-positioned Camp Lejeune. Day trips to Wilmington or Fayetteville are a breeze while fast-growing cities like Raleigh and Charlotte offer more urban and nightlife excitement easily obtained within a weekend getaway.






Things to Consider

JACKSONVILLE

What started out as a small fishing village in the 1700s has grown into the largest "city" in the area – Jacksonville, NC. Given that most of Camp Lejeune is located here, this city is deeply immersed in military life and culture and, of course, chock-full of military residents. Described as one of the youngest cities in the country, Jacksonville offers high energy as well as robust parks and recreation. Many military residents choose Jacksonville because of the nearby amenities, proximity to base and the beach, as well as ample affordable housing options.
